## Literature / Literature-EE Assessment Plan 2018-2019

Starting with the assessment of the 2013 graduating class in the Literature and Literature EE Program, program faculty revised the assessment plan in order to assess all program outcomes with all students annually. In 2018 the PLOs were reduced from six to five. This plan is appropriate for the size and scope of the program. The assessment plan measures progress in all PLOs and the five Core Competencies.

## **Program Learning Outcomes**

- 1. Integrate their literature studies with ongoing reflection and hospitable engagement with a diverse world.
- 2. Identify and articulate characteristics and trends of diverse literatures and historical periods, dates, styles, authors, and canon formation.
- 3. Develop and support close readings of texts using literary theory and terminology.
- 4. Employ strong research, rhetorical, linguistics, literary, and analytical skills in their writing.
- 5. Present literary analysis to formal audiences, demonstrating strategies for audience engagement and oral communication of written work.
