I am writing in support of Professor Charlene Pate who is applying for a reader=s card at the Huntington Library. Prof. Pate is my colleague in the Department of Literature, Languages, and Journalism here at Point Loma Nazarene University. While I was serving as Chair the last three years (I have just concluded my term of service), she was one of the faculty whom I supervised. Prof. Pate heads our Composition Program, in addition to teaching courses in Children=s Literature and Writing Theory and Pedagogy. In total, we have worked together for eighteen years.

Prof. Pate has been working on a research project focusing upon the connections between children=s literature and the early Sunday School movement. In May 2006, she was awarded a Wesleyan Center Fellowship from our University, and we travelled together to Manchester, UK, where we were both conducting research at the John Rylands Library, using archival materials in the World Methodist Collection. She thus has familiarity with research libraries and using proper care to handle manuscripts and early printed materials. She now wishes to further her research by consulting materials at the Huntington and hopes to publish the project upon which she is working, in addition to using the information in her teaching of children=s literature.

I have also been a reader at the Huntington Library for many years, beginning in 1985 with my graduate work under Paul Zall at the California State University, Los Angeles and continuing through my doctoral program at the University of California, Riverside under Stanley Stewart and John Steadman. I still use the collections occasionally, when I am able to drive up from San Diego.
