**Summary of Data collected:** This section should discuss the results of the assessment process for the designated SLO.

Data is collected annually in the senior seminar course at PLNU. We have used the ETS's major field exam for the Sociology since 2004. The results vary. Each year we have achieved the goal of having at least 50% at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile of the exam. This year we had exactly 50% (4 of 8) at that mark with a range of 88<sup>th</sup> percentile and 0. These scores are likely strongly correlated to the students GPA or possibly even their STA score.

Unfortunately, we did not conduct any other assessment activity during the 2010-2011 academic year. We revise and implement our assessment plan during the 2011-2012 academic year.
