


About Our Guest Presenter

David I. Smith is Director of the Kuyers Institute for Christian Teaching and Learning, and Director of Graduate Studies in Education at Calvin College. Smith's work focuses on the intersection between Christian faith and educational practice, with a particular interest in elucidating how teaching and learning can be pursued as forms of Christian practice. Smith has written numerous books, including the forthcoming *Teaching and Christian Imagination* (with Susan Felch, Barbara Carvill, Kurt Schaefer, Tim Steele, and John Witvliet), *Teaching and Christian Practices: Reshaping Faith and Learning* (co-edited with James K.A. Smith), and *Learning from the Stranger: Christian Faith and Cultural Diversity*, as well as many book sections and articles.

Smith received his undergraduate degree from the University of Oxford (UK), and holds a Masters in Philosophy from the Institute for Christian Studies (Canada), with his PhD in Education from the University of London (UK). Originally a native of the United Kingdom, he has also studied in Canada and taught in Germany. Before teaching at Calvin College, Smith was a researcher and teacher educator at the Stapleford Center in Nottingham, UK, and has been extensively involved in various curriculum initiatives and projects. He is currently the editor of the *International Journal of Christianity and Education*.


