Learning Opportunities

Below is a list of recent and coming events that provide students, faculty and staff opportunities to gain intercultural competence insights and skills:

- Gabriel Salguero Fall 2016: spoke in chapel (students, faculty and some staff) and provided a faculty workshop
- Ed Barron Fall 2016: spoke in chapel and provide a staff workshop.
- <u>Gabriel Salguero</u> Fall 2017: the featured speaker at Faculty Convocation and will be providing additional faculty workshops
- <u>Brenda Salter McNiel</u> Spring 2018: chapel, faculty and staff events as well as informal time with campus groups. She will be present for two days. (schedule from Mary)
- The Center for Justice and Reconciliation offers a monthly "Brewed Awakening" gathering that is a learning opportunity open to students, faculty and staff.
- MOSAIC has organized student panels to discuss diversity. This allows students to hear directly from their peers.
- Spring Civil Rights Pilgrimage program takes a group of students, faculty and staff to Selma, Alabama and other locations significant to civil rights movement. This learning experience has been significant for all who have participated. The pilgrimage is generally scheduled over spring break.
- Workshops on supporting military students are organized by the PLNU Director of Military Programs and Services. These workshops help faculty and staff better address the needs of active duty and recently separate military personnel. These are generally held twice each year.
