Job Title: Vice President for Spiritual Development

Job Status: Full-time, exempt

Reports To: President of the University

Location: Nicholson Commons

Purpose: Provide leadership to the specific areas of responsibility within Spiritual Development and demonstrate spiritual maturity in directing the spiritual development efforts of the total University, both undergraduate and graduate, in pursuit of the University's Mission and Vision. The Vice President is responsible to the University President and serves as a member of the Cabinet.

Responsibilities:

- Envision and direct the work of the Spiritual Development program in support of the University mission and vision. In the context of the Mission to teach, to shape, and to send; focus spiritual development on creating and sustaining a Wesleyan community where minds are engaged and challenged, character is modeled and formed, and service becomes an expression of deep faith.
- Develop, direct, and support the University's spiritual formation efforts, contextualized to the development needs of undergraduate and graduate students, through the programs and activities of Spiritual Development and in cooperation and coordination with the curricular and co-curricular efforts of the University.
- Insure the achievement and assessment of the spiritual development outcomes for individual programs and the total spiritual development effort.
- Develop new programs and modify or discontinue existing programs to meet changing needs and to achieve University mission and goals.
- Develop, oversee, and evaluate the chapel curriculum cycle and the accompanying spiritual formation outcomes.
- Chair the Spiritual Formation Committee.
- Lead the Directors and Staff of Spiritual Development and insure effective administration of those programs and responsibilities.
- Speak occasionally in the undergraduate chapel and Regional Centers.
- Serve as a member of the Administrative Cabinet.

Qualifications:

- Master's degree in a related field required. Doctoral degree and higher education experience preferred.
- Ordained Elder or Deacon in the Church of the Nazarene.
- Requires 15 years of demonstrated administrative experience and the capacity to lead at the senior level in a university context.
- Requires 15 years of demonstrated effectiveness in ministry.
- The ability to conceptualize and implement a complex university ministry that interfaces with curricular and co-curricular programs to achieve University mission and outcomes.
- Demonstrated leadership, communication, and relational skills.
- Demonstrated capacity to create, lead, and develop a team.
