COURSE DESCRIPTION

An introductory course emphasizing four basic skills: aural comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing. Also noted is the cultural and historical background of the areas where the language is spoken. Participation and active use of the language is emphasized in the classroom. Offered fall, spring, and summer.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES (CLOs)

By the end of the 101-102 sequence, students will be able to:

- 1. Speak at the mid to high novice level using basic formulaic and memorized materials within the student's own experience.
- 2. Recognize basic connected discourse that uses vocabulary and grammar within the student's own experience.
- 3. Write discrete sentences as well as simple connected paragraphs using memorized vocabulary and grammar structures.
- 4. Read cultural texts that employ familiar vocabulary and cognates as well as learned grammatical structures.
- 5. Demonstrate comprehension of basic cultural mores and patterns of living of the target culture(s) studied.

COURSE CREDIT HOUR INFORMATION

This class meets the Carnegie Unit minimum requirement of 750 minutes of instructional time + 1500 minutes of out-of-class work per 1 unit of credit. Specific details about how the class meets these requirements are included here in the course syllabus.

REQUIRED TEXT: Portales. Introductory Spanish. Blanco, Donley with Supersite Plus Code. For the text, students have the option to get the Portales ecompanion with 12 month access or Portales looseleaf with 12 month access (which I recommend) for students who feel they would benefit from a printed copy of the text. You will also need to buy a code for TalkAbroad which is a 30 minute conversation with a native Spanish speaker from an Hispanic country. This class requires technology access: This is the only way to complete your online assignments and assessments, and access study tools, media, your scores, and more for the main textbook.

Any exam not taken will automatically turn into an "F". Exam dates may be changed.

QUIZZES:

Oral and written quizzes may be unannounced and given, most of the time, after a new material is presented. There will be no make up quizzes.

All 1001 students must complete one conversation with <u>Talk Abroad</u> (available in the Bookstore). This conversation must be completed by <u>November 30th</u> so <u>please make your reservation</u> with plenty of time. No excuses will be accepted for not finishing it on time. Your conversation will be recorded so I can have access to it. This conversation will be graded based on vocabulary, grammar and clarity.

Cultural Events

All 1001 students must complete the four Cultural assignments in your syllabus. These must be done according to the directions given or no credit will be granted. They should be completed by November 30th.

Each cultural assignment must include a final Reflection: Based on your experiences with cultural observations, discuss your understanding and learning of some of the differences in ideas, customs, habits, art, music, food etc. The student will be graded based on content. Your reflection should be ½ page (double spaced, font 12) for each cultural event. This can be written in English.

No credit/partial credit will be granted if the required components are not followed.

Student Responsibilities in a Zoom Class

Enrollment in college assumes maturity, seriousness of purpose, and self-discipline. Taking a remote class should be considered as seriously as you would a face-to face class. Here's how we can all work together to create an environment of respect in order to maintain a positive learning environment for everyone:

- 1. Be present. Your camera should be turned on when you are in the Zoom classroom. Participation is graded every time we meet so please avoid being away during class otherwise your participation points will be deducted and obviously, it will affect the participation percentage of your grade.
- 2. Be respectful. Behave in the Zoom classroom as you would in a normal classroom. Please avoid distracting activities (using your phone, having a conversation with some other person, eating, etc.) You can mute your microphone when you are not talking, but do not forget to unmute to ask questions.
- 3. Student engagement, participation, and Zoom attendance directly affects your grade in this course. Points for zoom activities (quizzes, assignments, oral quizzes, dialogues, etc.) cannot be made up in the event of an absence, even if the absence is excused.

CLASS POLICIES:

- a) It is the student's responsibility to come prepared for the lesson for the day. Neither absence or tardiness will be considered an excuse for missing assignments, incomplete work, or otherwise not keeping up with class activities.
- b) The participation portion of the grade is based mostly on the student's active and voluntary participation in class activities; obviously, if you do not attend, you cannot participate. Failure to attend classes will result in lowered grades.
- c) Absences are counted from the first official meeting of the class regardless of the date the student's enrollment. A student who registers late must be careful about regular attendance during the remaining of the semester. No more than 100 minutes will be allowed for the whole semester, so please save them for the emergencies that always arise during the semester. A student will lose 1% of his/her final grade for every 50 minutes missed after the 100 minutes allowed. Leaving early or arriving late (including the days we meet at the lab) will count as missing time and therefore against your grade. After 6 unexcused absences, the professor reserves the right to de-enroll the student from the class. After 12 absences (20% of the grade), a student cannot pass the class, and will receive an F for the course (per university policy). AT ANY TIME DURING THE SEMESTER, the student will receive an automatic F for the course regardless of his or her test scores, etc. See Academic Policies in the Undergraduate Academic Catalog.
- d) Please be aware that three tardies (one to fourteen minutes) will equal 55 minutes. Any tardies in excess of 15 minutes will be counted as an absence (according to the catalog). A student is late when arriving after his/her name was called. A student may be dropped from the

roll as a result of excessive tardies.

e) The written portion of the grade is made up of all written work, which will include homework, online assignments, class work, compositions and other assignments. Students must submit the assigned online work by the due date. **NO LATE WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED/NO PARTIAL CREDIT.**


