COURSE DESCRIPTION

Academic Writing for Psychology is designed to equip you with the skills necessary to produce high-quality academic writing to be published in a psychology journal. We will focus on improving your ability to write an APA-style empirical paper comprised of a literature review, methods, results, and a discussion section. You will also learn about open science, the significance of replication, and the practical aspects of selecting the right journal, writing cover letters, and navigating the submission process. These skills will not only strengthen your academic scholarship but also provide you with valuable tools that can be applied in various professional contexts. Through a combination of readings, lectures, discussions, and hands-on practice, you will be evaluated on your understanding, professionalism, and ability to apply and communicate course material. By the end of the course, I hope you find these skills to be not only useful and engaging but also essential for your growth as a

writer and scholar in psychology.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

You will learn to:

- Write a comprehensive APA-style empirical paper, including a literature review, methods, results, and discussion sections
- Critically analyze and synthesize psychological research by reading and interpreting scientific articles.
- Enhance your writing skills through exercises in both creative and technical writing • Apply principles of open science
- Select an appropriate journal for your research and understand the practical steps involved in the submission process, including writing effective cover letters.
- Understand the peer review process, including responding to revision requests and preparing your manuscript for resubmission.
- Communicate research findings clearly and effectively to both academic and general audiences.

Objectives will be achieved through your engagement with readings, lectures, discussions, and hands-on practice. Your progress will be evaluated based on your understanding, professionalism, and ability to apply and communicate the course material through written assignments, participation, science communication, and a final manuscript submission.

Professionalism

Our hope is that the skills you learn in this class will translate to your aspirations, whatever they may be.

This class is a low stakes environment for you to learn, practice, and hone your skills. One necessary skill is

professionalism. Professionalism encompasses a host of components. In this class you will be expected to:

- Participate
- Be prepared
- Be familiar with course policies
- Be kind, respectful, and helpful
- Be on task
- Do your fair share when working with others

Feedback will help you to understand your own strengths and growth areas related to professionalism. Feedback will be received twice: in the middle of the semester and at the end of the semester. Midterm feedback will act as a mid-semester check in, and will hopefully stimulate constructive conversation among group members.

Everyone will provide feedback one more time at the end of the semester. This feedback will result in your final grades. These grades will be determined by both your classmates' observations as well as our own.

Professionalism is numerically and objectively calculated based on survey responses. Our own observations are considered equivalent to other students you have worked with, and survey responses are averaged across to produce a final grade. These averages are then transferred to the professionalism rubric. The most effective way to display commensurate (A+) professionalism is to communicate, delegate, listen, and be a nice human.

PLNU ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION POLICY

Regular and punctual attendance at all class sessions is considered essential to optimum academic achievement. If the student is absent for more than 10 percent of class sessions, the faculty member will issue a written warning of de-enrollment. No late work will be accepted. This policy will mainly impact manuscript submissions. Timely submission of these assignments is crucial because each part of the manuscript builds on a previous submission, and delays can hinder your progress and the feedback process. Given that the final goal of the course is to submit a polished manuscript, adhering to deadlines ensures that you stay on track to meet this objective.

FINAL EXAMINATION POLICY

Successful completion of this class requires participating in the final examination on its scheduled day. If you find yourself scheduled for three (3) or more final examinations on the same day, you are authorized to contact each professor to arrange a different time for one of those exams. However, unless you have three (3) or more exams on the same day, no requests for alternative final examinations will be granted.

You are allowed to use Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools (e.g., ChatGPT, Gemini Pro 1.5, GrammarlyGo, Perplexity, etc.) in this course. Any work that utilizes AI-based tools must be clearly identified as such, including the specific tool(s) used. This means you must cite when using AI, following APA style for your citations. If you do not cite your sources, this is considered plagiarism. Additionally, solely copying AI produced text without significant modification is also considered plagiarism. AI-generated text must be altered to incorporate your own voice, insights, and understanding. The first time a violation occurs, you will receive a warning; subsequent violations will result in a zero on the assignment. Importantly, all group members must be in unanimous agreement over the use of AI tools.

PLNU ACADEMIC ACCOMMODATIONS POLICY
