Conclusions Drawn from Data: 65% of students are distinguished or commendable, which is okay and shows that both knowledge specialization and integration are occurring for most students. Still, this number can be improved and should hit the 80% mark.

Changes to be Made Based on Data: I think an increased emphasis on comparison across the philosophers is called for in some key areas, which should improve both competency areas and especially integration. I also think that some practice evaluations that mimic this instrument should be placed at different times across the semester. That way students are more familiar with this type of instrument and, more importantly, have practiced this type of comparative analysis throughout the semester.
