**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

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This laboratory course provides structured, coach-led practical experience in strength training and conditioning. Students will participate in a supervised 90-minute training session each week designed to:

- Develop technical proficiency in foundational and advanced lifts
- Experience structured program design in real time
- Apply exercise science concepts from the companion lecture course
- Learn coaching cues, corrections, and training organization through lived experience

Students will train under direct instruction and receive individualized coaching. Emphasis is placed on movement quality, effort, training structure, and professional coaching standards.

In addition to weekly lab sessions, students will complete one independent resistance training session per week to reinforce skill development and promote training consistency.

This course complements the Strength and Conditioning lecture course and emphasizes application over theory.

Prerequisite or Corequisite: KIN 3070.

### COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

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- Demonstrate technically sound execution of foundational strength, power, and conditioning movements.
- Apply appropriate coaching cues to improve lifting mechanics.
- Execute structured training sessions that reflect proper sequencing, volume, intensity, and rest.
- Experience and reflect on different coaching styles and training modalities. Maintain a consistent training journal documenting progression and effort. Exhibit professionalism, preparedness, and effort in a training environment.

### COURSE GRADING AND ASSIGNMENTS

### EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

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## 1. Attendance

Attendance is mandatory. This course is experiential and cannot be replicated through make-up work.

- Arrive on time, dressed appropriately for training.
- Late arrivals may result in partial credit.
- Unexcused absences result in loss of attendance points.

- Excessive absences may result in course failure.

## 2. Effort and Engagement

Students are expected to:

- Train with appropriate intensity.
- Apply coaching feedback.
- Demonstrate professionalism and respect for peers.
- Contribute to a focused training environment.

Effort is evaluated on observable engagement, not performance level. Strength or athletic background is irrelevant. Commitment and coachability are central.

## 3. Independent Training Requirement

Each week students must:

- Complete one additional resistance training session outside of lab.
- Record the session in a written or digital training journal.
- Capture one 3–5 second video clip from that session.

The journal must include:

- Exercises performed
- Sets and reps
- Load (if applicable)
- Brief reflection (1–2 sentences on performance, difficulty, or technical focus)

At the end of the semester, students will submit:

- Their complete training journal
- A compiled video containing 30 total clips (15 lab + 15 independent)
