On behalf of the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), I am pleased to advise you that at its fall meeting the CCNE Board of Commissioners reviewed the continuous improvement progress report submitted by the baccalaureate degree program in nursing and master's degree program in nursing at Point Loma Nazarene University and determined that the programs continue to meet all accreditation standards.

As you are aware, programs are expected to comply with the current CCNE standards and procedures throughout the period of accreditation. These reporting requirements are discussed further in the CCNE *Procedures*.
