Project Guidelines

Students have been given the follow guidelines for the their project:

GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF WELL ELDER:

- Select and contract with a well elder person (62 or older) to visit during the semester.
- The person may be a relative, friend or neighbor.
- Persons may be selected through church or retirement community settings.
- Should it become necessary to select a different well elder during this project, please notify your clinical faculty in a timely manner.

Attaches a complete nursing plan of care including all of the following element: A realistic, time framed and measureable outcome, At least 3 appropriate / priority nursing interventions that are based on the priority diagnosis and action-oriented with stated frequencies.
