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Figure 1. Frequency with which PLNU CTL services are used (n = 84).

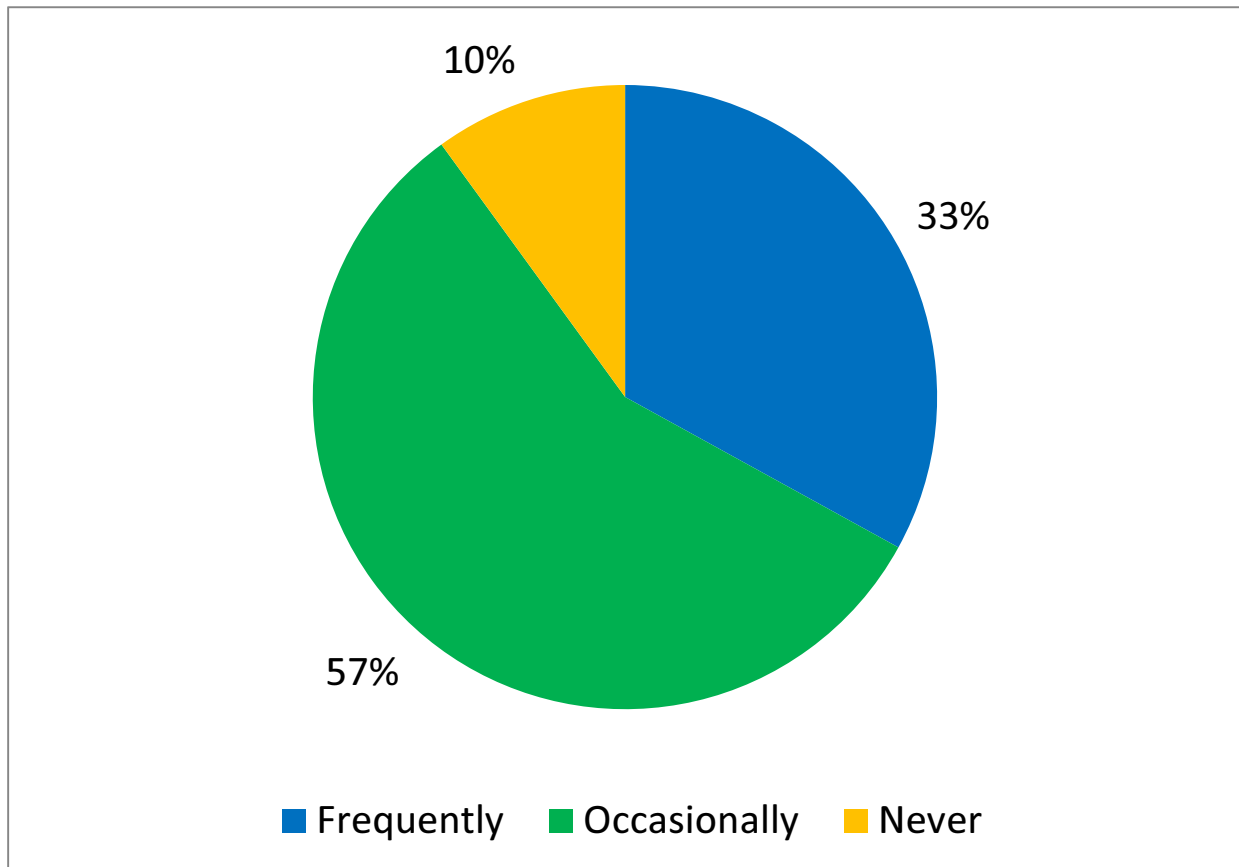


Figure 2. Current position of CTL users (n = 65).

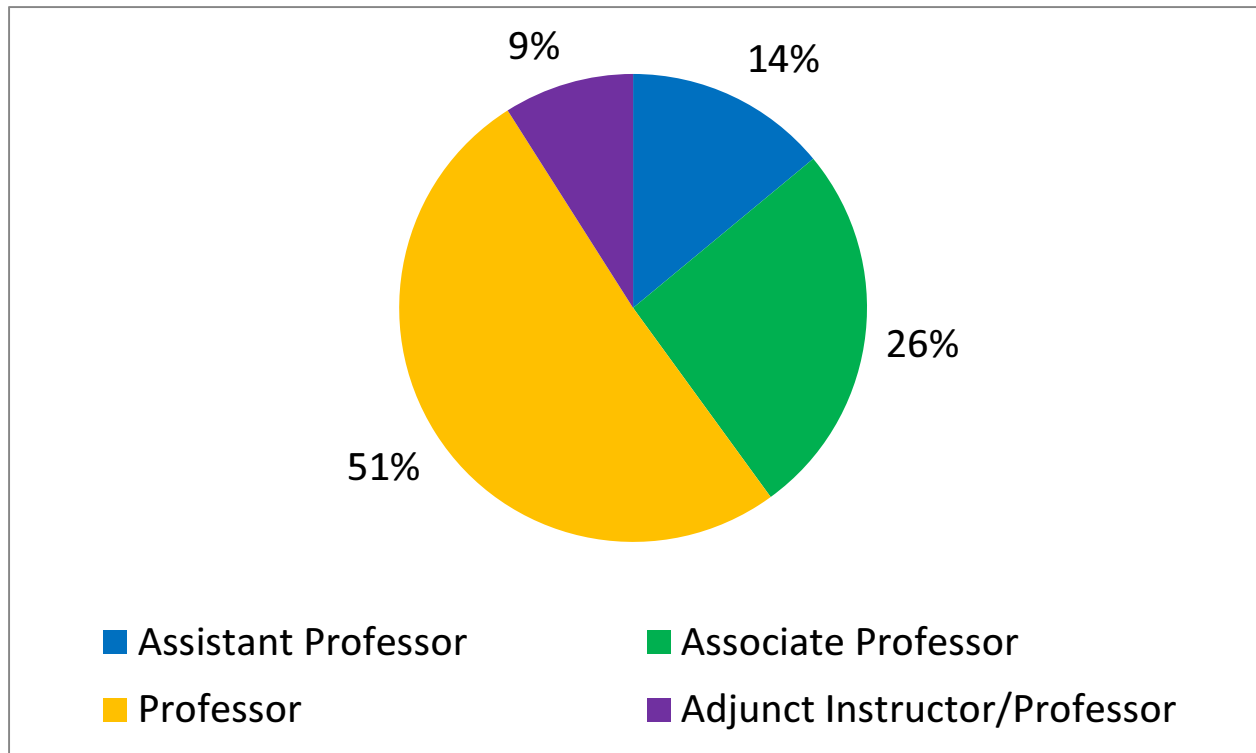


Figure 3. Length in current position of CTL users (n = 63).

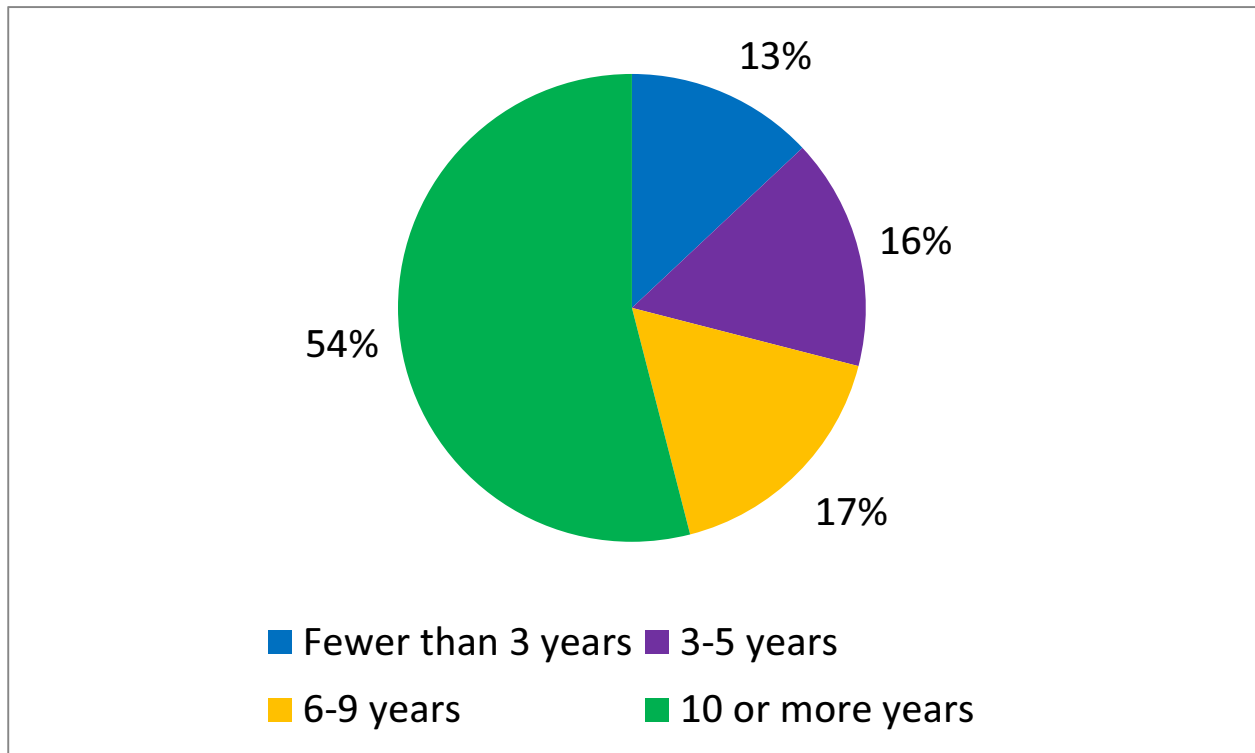


Figure 4. Primary teaching location of CTL users (n = 65).

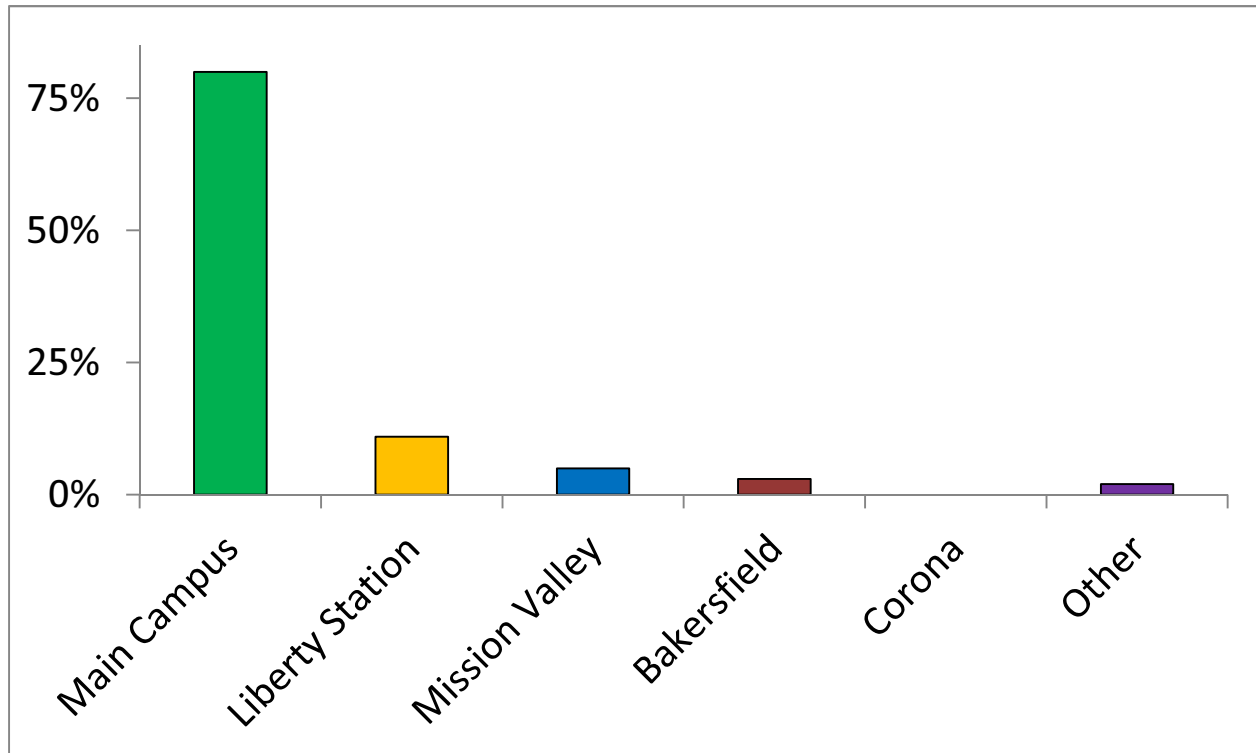
