A school that offers a student enrolled in its out-of-state, residential program the opportunity to fulfill a practicum or clinical requirement in Iowa is also not subject to registration.

The Commission does not accept formal exemption applications but will provide an email confirming that the schools is not required, at that time, to comply with any Iowa statute or rule.
