COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students will be mentored by a clinical professional approved by the course instructor. This is an internship for academic credit which includes weekly discussion directed by the professor on campus.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Students and professor will use vocabulary unique to the professional practitioner.
2. Students will participate in clinical service within the context of the clinical mission and federal guidelines.
3. Students will prepare and organize documents to prepare for graduate school.
4. Students will write case histories in technical style in AMA format and present them.
5. Students

will work in teams to create and present a case study and final presentation.

COURSE CREDIT INFORMATION

This course requires that the student complete both the classroom and on/off campus clinic rotations.

COURSE SCHEDULE AND ASSIGNMENTS

1) **Reading quizzes:** Most weeks, there will be a reading quiz at the start of class. These brief 15 point quizzes are designed to ensure students read material prior to class. The quiz content covers subsections from the UCSD Practical Guide to Clinical Medicine. The topics covered in each week's quiz are outlined in the chart below. The quiz structure may include true/false, multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank questions.

2) **Resume:** Students will complete an up-to-date resume which includes both academic and related professional experience(s). Student resumes should be **one page maximum**. Resumes will be graded on organization, structure, content and should include current clinical placement for KIN4088C. Please utilize the Office of Strengths and Vocation if needed.

3) **Personal Statement/Essay:** Students will prepare a graduate school personal statement/essay. Grades will be determined based on organization and content of the response. Students will be deducted points for exceeding the word limit. For those of you interested in physical therapy after your undergraduate education, you will respond to the essay question on the PTCAS website. For those of you interested in occupational therapy after your undergraduate education, you will respond to the essay question on the OTCAS website.

4) **PTCAS/OTCAS profile:** For this assignment, you will receive credit for creating an online profile through one of two websites. These centralized application systems for both physical and occupational therapy will be essential for your admission into graduate school. These application service websites are free to create an account. You will receive full credit if you are able to forward me your email confirmation that you have created an account through either PTCAS or OTCAS. Students will not be required to apply to graduate schools at this time.

5) **Graduate school spreadsheet:** The purpose of this assignment is to create a log of important information compiled from different graduate programs. This will be a valuable tool for you when it is time to apply to graduate schools. Students will be required to have at least five graduate schools for either PT or OT on your spreadsheet. Typically, students apply for at least five schools; please choose schools which you are interested in. Students should include information including due dates for fees, deadline application, early decision deadlines, program prerequisites, average accepted student GPA and GRE scores, observation hours, average class size, number of classes per calendar year, and any other information you feel is important. Feel free to organize the spreadsheet however you like. You will be graded on organization of the

spreadsheet and quality of information included. If it is difficult for the instructor to view the information, you will be deducted points.

7) Case study/studies: You will be required to complete **two** case studies. Please see grid for due dates; one case study will NOT be presented in class. The case studies will be in AMA format, 3-5 pages in length, double-spaced, 12-point font and will be uploaded to Canvas by 245pm on the due date. *No late assignments will be accepted.* The case study will include client data (age, gender, occupation, recreational activities), history (chief complaint and all relevant history), results of physical examination (objective findings), diagnosis, treatment and treatment outcomes, deviations from anticipated outcomes, and any insight gained from the case (through clinical mentor or literature review). Students will be required to cite at least two reputable references using AMA format when completing these assignment(s). There will be a case study example, case study guidelines, and how to properly cite in AMA format. Case studies will be graded on organization and quality of content. Well-written responses help the instructor visualize and understand the key components of the case.

8) Case study presentation: The purpose of this assignment is to gain familiarity using professional language and presenting a patient to your peers. Each student will give an oral presentation of his/her case study patient. Presentation dates will be assigned and students will be given adequate notice of presentation dates. Students will dress in business casual attire for the presentations (no jeans of any color, closed toe shoes- please ask if you have any questions regarding business casual attire). Please take note of which day you are presenting and plan attire accordingly. These individual presentations should be five minutes in length and will have 2-3 minutes of discussion and questions afterwards. Students will be deducted points if presentations are under three minutes or over seven minutes. Students will also answer questions from classmates and also one question from the instructor. Students will create a short powerpoint to help illustrate his/her patient . Students will be graded based on meeting the time criteria, ability to provide a clear explanation of the patient case, overall presentation and by the response to the peer/instructor questions.

9) Final Group project: All KIN488 students will be required to complete a final group project. Students will work in groups assigned by the instructor. For this semester, it is expected that students meet virtually in order to complete this project. This project will include both a 5-8 page typed case study report and a 15-20 minute group presentation. Forty points will be assigned to the group project write up, 50 points to the presentation and 10 points for peer review (e.g., participation, availability, contribution) for a total of 100 points. All members of the group will be required to contribute to the case study write up and each student will be required to present. Questions and discussion will follow each group presentation. For these case studies, each group will be assigned a hypothetical case study patient. In addition to covering the information in a normal case study, students will be required to provide resources (at least 5; not

to be included with page count) which cover patient demographics, phases and/or progression of rehabilitation, and expected outcomes of rehabilitation. These projects will be presented on the final exam day. Students are advised to use powerpoint and/or other visuals to aid in their presentations. This project will take the place of a written final examination. You are required to be present for the entire duration of the final presentations or you will lose points for your completed project.

10) **Clinical Hours:** Clinical hours will be recorded on the excel document found on Canvas. You are expected to keep the hard copy with you record hours each time you are in the clinic. Please record date, time, supervisor signatures and student signatures. You will need a copy for your records when you apply for graduate school.
