Interpretation and conclusion: The consistent trend in the data for this major is in the area of application, the ability to make judgements and draw appropriate conclusions, they were very close to meeting the 80% criteria. As explained in the HHP major outcomes, this is a lab-based class where students are typically hands on learning the skills they are being asked to calculate, apply and make assumptions about. Since the students in the fall and many of the students in the spring did not have the opportunity to learn in the lab, they may not have been able to connect to the data set and apply the information as well.

Interpretation and Conclusion: In general, scores across all three measurement tools were lowest in the fall when compared to the spring 2021 data. This is most likely due to the mode of delivery in the fall. Overall, our students struggled to meet the criteria for information literacy, this is evidenced by the low scores when compared to fall 19, spring 20 and 21 semesters. Improvements were observed in the critical thinking criteria when comparing the fall to the spring semester, again these changes most likely occurred as a result of the change to teaching modality. This hypothesis is supported by the lower scores on the critical thinking rubric in spring of 2020 when we first began our remote teaching. Within the written communication rubric, we did not meet the criteria for the purpose and content in the fall, however, we just barely missed our set criteria so we are not too concerned.
