

Cross-Disciplinary Studies (CDS) – Teacher Education [Undergraduate Degree] - Curriculum Mapping: 2021-2022

The Cross-Disciplinary Studies – Teacher Education degree includes required upper-division coursework specifically within the School of Education. Table 1 presents the 7 Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) for the major and lists the EDU courses where each of these 7 outcomes are Practiced (P), Developed (D), and Mastered (M). In addition to the upper-division EDU coursework listed in Table 1, students take coursework in non-EDU academic departments, in order to fulfill their CDS major AND their CSET subject matter competency requirements, as per PLNU's agreement with the California CTC. These additional required lower-division and upper-division courses are listed in Tables 2 and 3.
