COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course offers an introduction to a variety of foundational printmaking techniques and processes, including techniques in relief, intaglio, monotype, lithography, and silkscreen printmaking.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Students will be challenged to:

1. Understand and utilize safe and effective studio practices in printmaking.
2. Gain familiarity and ease with fundamental printmaking processes, including relief, intaglio, monotype, lithography, and silkscreen printmaking processes.
3. Show an awareness of a range of historical precedents for printmaking, and apply this awareness to their practice, in order to contextualize their work within printmaking's history.
4. Apply printmaking techniques to express personal and inventive visual ideas.
5. Exemplify effective work habits including consistency in practice, goal setting, risk taking, and personal introspection.
6. Use printmaking vocabulary and critical thinking skills to critique the work of their classmates, themselves, and those in the broader art world(s).

METHODS

Instruction will be given through: live class lectures, hands on projects, demonstrations, small group discussions, one-on-one discussion with the instructor, class critiques, and a workshop with a visiting artist.

ASSIGNMENTS

- Linocut project — weeks 2-4 — 20% of grade
- Drypoint project — weeks 4-7 — 20% of grade
- Monotype and lithography project — weeks 7-9 — 20% of grade
- Silkscreen project — weeks 10-12 — 20% of grade
- Final artist research project and print exchange — weeks 13-16 — 20% of grade

Grading criteria: Projects will be graded based on technique, composition, craftsmanship, expression, and commitment to practice. The full detailed rubric is included on canvas in each assignment module.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance at all class sessions is required. Attendance in class means that you are prepared for class with all necessary materials, and actively engage with the discussions or working on your printmaking project during the entire class period.

- Missing four classes will result in your final grade being reduced by one letter grade.
- Missing five classes will result in your grade being reduced by two letter grades.
- Missing six classes will result in failure of the class.
- Coming to class late three times is equivalent to one absence.

If you need to miss class because you are sick or have an emergency, please communicate this with me via email.

STUDIO POLICIES

Studio safety during the COVID19 pandemic: You are responsible for keeping up to date on current Covid-19 policies put in place on the PLNU campus. Failure to comply with these policies in class will result in a loss of privileges to the studio space.

Eating and drinking: Eating and drinking will be allowed during lecture or discussion time, but will not be allowed during studio work time in class. If you need to take a break to eat, please eat outside in the courtyard.

Clean up: Keeping the studio space clean and organized is vital to ensuring a safe and productive work environment for everyone. **Cleanup is especially important in the printmaking studio due to the messy nature of many of the techniques we will be covering and because we are sharing the space with the fab lab.**

At the end of each class session, and at the end of any work session in the studio, all materials must be stored and work areas completely cleaned. Failure to cleanup your mess may result in a fine or grade reduction.

LATE WORK POLICY

Any work turned in after the deadline will result in a 20% initial grade deduction, then 10% for each additional day that the assignment is late.

COURSE CREDIT HOUR INFORMATION

In the interest of providing sufficient time to accomplish the stated Course Learning Outcomes, this class meets the PLNU credit hour policy for a 3 unit class delivered over 16 weeks. It is anticipated that students will spend a minimum of 37.5 participation hours per credit hour on their coursework. For this course, students will spend an

estimated 112.5 total hours (7 hours per week) meeting the course learning outcomes.
