COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a beginning pickleball course in which students will develop the basic skills to play the game of pickleball. These will include: safety, etiquette, rules, scoring, forehand and backhand groundstrokes, volleys, serves, lobs, overheads, dink shots, proper footwork, basic strategies and court positioning for singles and doubles play. Basic fitness and training principles will be discussed as applicable to the sport of pickleball.

FE/COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Demonstrate how the fundamentals of health-related fitness apply to the sport of pickleball.
2. Explain how the concepts of health-related fitness apply in the sport of pickleball.
3. Demonstrate the basic skills of forehand and backhand groundstrokes, serves, dinks, overhead and volley shots used in the sport of pickleball.
4. Apply the basic playing strategies in singles and doubles formats in the sport of pickleball.
5. Apply the strategies of pickleball during in-class play.
6. Demonstrate knowledge of the history and rules of pickleball.

REQUIRED: Pickleball paddle, appropriate shoes (no black-soled rubber shoes or sandals). We will offer temporary paddles until you are able to secure your own.

COURSE CREDIT HOUR INFORMATION

In the interest of providing sufficient time to accomplish the stated Course Learning Outcomes, this class meets the PLNU credit hour policy for a 1 unit class delivered over 15 weeks. It is anticipated that students will spend a minimum of 37.5 participation hours per credit hour on their coursework. For this course, students will spend an estimated 37.5 total hours meeting the course learning outcomes. The time estimations are provided in the Canvas modules.
