COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a course for students planning to pursue a career in health professions. The course will prepare students for the application and interview process to health professions schools. This course will include a timeline of the application process, revision of the personal statement and list of work and activities, practice interviews, recommendations to strengthen the application, recommendation letters, and preliminary school selection.

Consent of the Instructor Required

Prerequisite: Planned submission of application to health professions school during spring/summer of the current academic year or after graduation.

PLNU ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION POLICY

Students taking hybrid courses lasting over 14 weeks are expected to attend each week of the course. Attendance is defined as logging into the course each calendar week to check on updates and announcements. In addition, students must participate in the academic graded activities during the calendar week the assignments/activities are due.

Regular and punctual attendance at all class sessions is considered essential to optimum academic achievement. If the student is absent for more than 10 percent of class sessions, the faculty member will issue a written warning of de-enrollment. If the absences exceed 20 percent, the student may be de-

enrolled without notice until the university drop date or, after that date, receive the appropriate grade for their work and participation.

In some courses, most of the credit hour content will be delivered **asynchronously** and attendance will be determined by submitting the assignments by the posted due dates. See Academic Policies in the Undergraduate Academic Catalog. If absences exceed these limits but are due to university-excused health issues, an exception will be granted.

Asynchronous Attendance/Participation Definition

A day of attendance in asynchronous content is determined as contributing a substantive note, assignment, discussion, or submission by the posted due date. Failure to meet these standards will result in an absence for that day. Instructors will determine how many asynchronous attendance days are required each week.
