# COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course explores a process for ethical decision making in order to develop a stakeholder approach to leadership. Focus will be given to creating a framework for evaluating ethical choices and applying that framework to ethical dilemmas in organizations.

# FINAL EXAM POLICY

Successful completion of this class requires taking the final examination on its scheduled day. For this class it is a final paper instead of exam. The final paper for this course, due on August 18<sup>th</sup> at 11:59 PM, is designed to build upon previous drafts, culminating in a comprehensive reflection on ethical decision-making models. This assignment will require you to draft and justify an ethical decision-making model that you find most compelling. Your paper should incorporate insights gained from engaging with various ethical approaches examined throughout the course, illustrating how these perspectives inform your chosen model. The final paper is to be submitted by the deadline through the Canvas assignment link. Extensions will be granted if a student contacts the instructor before the deadline due to an unavoidable medical emergency. Proper documentation will be required. Extensions will not be granted for other commitments or scheduling conflicts.
