COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a beginning pickleball course in which students will develop the basic skills to play the game of pickleball. These will include: safety, etiquette, rules, scoring, forehand and backhand groundstrokes, volleys, serves, lobs, overheads, dink shots, proper footwork, basic strategies and court positioning for singles and doubles play. Basic fitness and training principles will be discussed as applicable to the sport of pickleball.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

- 1. Demonstrate how the fundamentals of health-related fitness apply to the sport of pickleball.
- 2. Explain how the concepts of health-related fitness apply in the sport of pickleball.
- 3. Demonstrate the basic skills of forehand and backhand groundstrokes, serves, dinks, overhead and volley shots used in the sport of pickleball.
- 4. Apply the basic playing strategies in singles and doubles formats in the sport of pickleball.
- 5. Apply the strategies of pickleball during in-class play.
- 6. Demonstrate knowledge of the history and rules of pickleball.

REQUIRED: Pickleball paddle, appropriate shoes (no black-soled rubber shoes or sandals). We will offer temporary paddles until you are able to secure your own.

Students will develop an understanding of self that fosters personal well-being.

PLNU ACADEMIC ACCOMMODATIONS POLICY

PLNU is committed to providing equal opportunity for participation in all its programs, services, and activities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Students with disabilities may request course-related accommodations by contacting the Educational Access Center (EAC), located in the Bond Academic Center (EAC@pointloma.edu or 619-849-2486). Once a student's eligibility for an accommodation has been determined, the EAC will work with the student to create an Accommodation Plan (AP) that outlines allowed accommodations. The EAC makes accommodations available to professors at the student's request.

PLNU highly recommends that students speak with their professors during the first two weeks of each semester/term about the implementation of their AP in that particular course.

Accommodations are not retroactive so clarifying with the professor at the outset is one of the best ways to promote positive academic outcomes.

Students who need accommodations for a disability should contact the EAC as early as possible (i.e., ideally before the beginning of the semester) to assure appropriate accommodations can be provided. It is the student's responsibility to make the first contact with the EAC. Students cannot assume that because they had accommodations in the past, their eligibility at PLNU is automatic. All determinations at PLNU must go through the EAC process. This is to protect the privacy of students with disabilities who may not want to disclose this information and are not asking for any special accommodations

PLNU ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION POLICY

Regular and punctual attendance at all class sessions is considered essential to optimum academic achievement. If the student is absent for more than 10 percent of class sessions, the faculty member will issue a written warning of de-enrollment. If the absences exceed 20 percent, the student may be de-enrolled without notice until the university withdrawal date or, after that date, receive an "F" grade.
